Red lines show travels made during the first presidential term. The green ones, those made during the second term




PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA (2009-2015)

Blue lines show travels made during the first presidential term. The green ones, the trips durings the second term


President Obama made so far 88 official visits abroad.

Their Secretaries of State took the worst part: more than 200 trips during their four year terms. Do these trips reflect the U.S. geopolitical foreign policy?





They don't reflect the exactly itinerary of those trips. The original ones were broken up and Washington was stablished as the origin.

The goal was to show the number of times they visited a country, in order to see if there's a pattern than can reflect U.S. foreign policy.

The darker the color of a path is, the more times a person visited a country. These maps include the visits to Palestinian Authority as a separate trip. The reason: in the DS' website, trips to Palestine are separated from the trips to Israel under the country tab.
